From the "Pen" of Pastor Paula

FOR OCTOBER TIDINGS:

INTERNATIONAL HEALTH PARTNERS U.S. & TANZANIA

"Trusting God. Following the teachings of Jesus Christ to one another is what makes life worth living. It is what we are here to do." Paula Lofstrom, RN and Managing Director of IHP, U.S. & Tanzania. "Tunashukuru sana!" (We are very grateful!) David West, Board Member & son of Paula Lofstrom.

Paula Lofstrom and David West will be in our midst Saturday, October 25th and Sunday, October 26th to share their journeys as part of International Health Partners U.S. & Tanzania.

HOW IT BEGAN: the late Dr. Dennis Lofstrom, his wife, Paula and Mary Kitundu RN answered God's call to bring health care to underserved people in Tanzania in 2002 when Askofu (Bishop) Gideon Maghine asked them to restore lambi Lutheran Hospital. This is located near Singida where I served a pastoral internship. The late Askofu Maghine was my supervisor and very active in the work of IHP until his death a few years ago. By 2006, the lambi Hospital was seeing an average of 110 patients a day and 80-90% occupancy in the rehabilitated hospital. It was turned over to the Lutheran church, fully staffed, equipped and self-sustaining.

AND THE WORK CONTINUES: in 2006, IHP began building Nyakato Health Center near Mwanza in the East of Lake Victoria diocese (Lutheran). From 2006-2012, the clinic saw 120 patients a day and 122,000 active charts and is now self-sustaining.

In 2007, IHP founded St. John's University School of Nursing in Dodoma with an average of 130 nurses a year graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and a total of 1400 students in various healthcare programs.

Tanzania has 22 million children under 15 years of age. IHP built the first children's hospital in Zinga on the coast of the Indian Ocean, opening in 2016. It is now self-sustaining.

TODAY: the newest project is a new medical facility in Chihoni, 24 miles northwest of Dodoma in central Tanzania. In that area, the greatest underseved need is for women's health services and resources for the elderly.

PEACE UCC CONNECTION: for the past couple of years, the Peace Church Endowment Fund has sent financial support to IHP. Now we, along with the general public, have an opportunity to hear Paula's and David's stories as well as admire and buy Tanzanian handicrafts to support the latest facility at Chihoni. There will be a presentation and potluck following worship on the 26th.

Thank you in advance to the Giffords and Pastors Mark and Margaret for providing housing! More details to follow! KARIBUNI SANA! You are all very welcome!!!

Council Minutes for 9-11-2025

Present: Mike Anderson, Donna Buckman, Steve Mc Corkindale, Pastor Paula Anderson, Marlis Huinker, Elaine Martin, Dean Gray.

Mike called the meeting to order at 5:32 PM. Pastor Paula provided devotions. Mike asked for approval of the August minutes, Marlis made a motion to approve seconded by Donna, motion passed.

Financial Report: Income down \$3500 and expenses up \$1500. Concerned about significant increase in electrical bill, Marlis has been pursuing an explanation from Alliant. Plan to make line item header adjustments to the financial worksheet to include a change in the line for Bell Choir donations to also include Stephen Ministry and Grace Cafe. Also adjusted header in Office expenses to Telephone/Internet/ and Website. In the Finance/ Memorial section adjusting a line item header for Memorial Disbursements. Also received a \$1500 adjustment from Access for an overpayment of the copy machine. Plan to place another ad in INDEED for music director in September. Still waiting for the new Commerce credit card, may consider going with Freedom Bank, Marlis made a motion to move to a Freedom Bank credit card, seconded by Donna, motion carried. Steve moved to approve the financial report, Donna seconded. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report: In the past month, Pastor Paula has participated 3 clergy text study, prep for 3 Sunday worship (bulletins and sermons), Tidings article, miscellaneous secretarial duties, helping with Becky's orientation, calls, emails and visitations, Elkader Care Center Service, prep for confirmation, Fall Festival meeting, and meeting with those interested in restarting Seekers. Steve moved to approve the pastor's report, Donna seconded.

Building and Grounds: Dave Dennler will be here the week of the 9th to install basement windows in the parsonage. The tree by parsonage needs trimming, hitting the church, John Thompson will be contacted. The lawn mower was repaired by Cletus Keppler from Royal Products.

Worship and Altar: Outdoor service on the 31st was successful, the sound system worked great, 32 people attended.

Christian Education: Confirmation will start 9-10 for Cooper Burns

Missions: In August we served 77 meals, We were able to donate \$250 to the Central School Caring Closet. Next Grace Cafe, Sept 18th. Planning for the donations from the September and October meals going to the Central School lunch program. The school office will put money towards students that need lunch for the day or towards student families that have fallen behind. The date for the Fall Festival will be November 23rd, planning to serve ham and meatballs, salad and desserts.

Memorial: Christmas light displays have arrived. Proposal for the purchase of Bell Choir music was moved and seconded by Steve and Dean motion was approved. The Council would like the Memorial committee to explore electronic sign options.

Old Business: Phones: 2-line phone system purchased and was installed by Becky and Paula, church currently has 1 line which will meet the current need of the office. **Becky's Background check:** waiting for results **INDEED:** plan to place an ad in September for music director.

New Commerce credit card: waiting for it to arrive

New Business: Salary for interim Bell and vocal music director, will be \$125 monthly for each, starting in June (Sue Gnagy has asked not to be paid) **Review Insurance coverage:** yearly questionnaire needs to be completed, Marlis and Steve will complete. **Pastor relocation:** Pastor's current apartment building has been sold, a downstairs one level apt has been secured for \$800 a month across from old Miller dairy. The planned move will be at the end of October.

The next meeting is October 13th at 5:30.
